

Celebrate your family with these fun activity suggestions!

Parent and Child Handprint Art – Make a beautiful art print of your hands together! Add washable paint to your palms, making sure you cover them as much as possible. Then press your hands down firmly and flat on paper. After a couple seconds, carefully lift your hands off the paper, making sure to not smear the paint.

What We Love to Do Together Art Project – What do you and your family like to do together? Using art supplies like pencils, crayons, markers, or paint (and even stickers!), illustrate this activity and keep it for a fun memory of your time together.

Family Photo Book/Scrapbook – Gather family pictures and other mementos, and tell the unique story of your own family! Add pictures or items – anything that celebrates your immediate or extended family – to an empty photo album or special notebook. Don't forget to secure the pictures with tape, glue, or paper clips. For a personal touch, decorate the pages with stickers, markers, or other art supplies.

Write Your Own Adventure Story – Imagine an adventure you and your family could go on. Get creative! Think of details to include, like location and how you'd get there, what you'd bring, what you might see or experience there, and how you'd get back. You can even take turns with your family coming up with different parts of the story. Don't want to write? Just tell the story to your family at dinner, before bed, or even record it on your phone or computer!

Book Character Dress Up – Do you have a favorite book? Dress up like your favorite character! It will help transport you to the setting of the story, making you feel like you're in a whole other world.

Play a Storytelling Game – Boost your imagination with storytelling! Using the materials available here, create a pair of homemade dice to help you come up with a unique tale. Following the instructions, see what story elements you roll to make up your own story. Turn it into a family game by having each family member take turns!
